

CCSF Named Scholarship Descriptions

WILLIAM W. ANDERSON MEMORIAL SCHOLARSHIP FUND: A lifelong resident of Concord who graduated from Concord High School in 1942 and who was a local store owner from 1946 until 1992.

BEAN FAMILY SCHOLARSHIP FUND: Established at the time of the death of one of their 4 daughters, all graduates of CCHS in the 1970's, in the spirit of respect for the educators at CCHS.

TRUDY BIERNSON MEMORIAL SCHOLARSHIP FUND: A long-time Concord music educator, performer, and enthusiastic promoter of the performing arts.

CONCORD WOMEN'S CLUB/RUTH BULLERWELL SCHOLARSHIP FUND: In memory a long time resident of Concord and an active participant in many organizations in town including the Concord Women's Club.

MARY CONNORTON MEMORIAL SCHOLARSHIP FUND: Established as the result of a bequest to CCSF from Mary Connorton, the last surviving member of a longtime Concord family and an employee of the town of Concord.

ELAINE DiCICCO SCHOLARSHIP FUND: In honor of a lifelong resident of Concord who was principal of CCHS for 24 years. Prior to her appointment as principal, Elaine also taught French at the high school, and served as an assistant to the superintendent of schools and as director of personnel.

JOHN B. FINIGAN MEMORIAL SCHOLARSHIP FUND: A lifelong resident of Concord who served the town in a number of roles, including that of Selectman, and who operated a real estate firm in Concord.

WILSON FLIGHT SCHOLARSHIP FUND: Established by the Berry Foundation in honor of a CCHS science teacher known for his innovative teaching methods and the learning trips he organized for his students.

ESSIE GOLDEN MEMORIAL SCHOLARSHIP FUND: In memory of a past resident of Concord who was a businesswoman and an environmental activist.

BOBBY GRAY MEMORIAL SCHOLARSHIP FUND: A graduate of CHS '57, who was a constant presence at Concord High School (CHS) and Concord-Carlisle Regional High School (CCHS) sports teams' games.

THE MARGARET HAGGERTY MEMORIAL SCHOLARSHIP FUND: Established as the result of a bequest to CCSF from Margaret Haggerty of Concord. In the 1840s, her grandfather, Patrick Haggerty, was one of the first people of Irish ancestry to settle in Concord.

THE WELLS A. HALL MEMORIAL SCHOLARSHIP FUND: In memory of Wells A. Hall, an innovative educator, who was superintendent of schools in Concord for 31 years.

THE CHRISTOPHER HENTCHEL WIQH SCHOLARSHIP FUND: In memory of a member of the Concord-Carlisle High School Class of 2008 and active member of the school's radio station WIQH, who died in 2008, in a car accident.

THE SEITARO and SHINA ISHIHARA MEMORIAL SCHOLARSHIP FUND and THE TAMEJI and CHIYO YOSHIMURA MEMORIAL SCHOLARSHIP FUND: Tama and Jiro Ishihara, U.S. citizens of Japanese descent who, with their families, were interned in camps in this country during World War II. The Civil Liberties Act of 1988 was passed to compensate the surviving former internees \$20,000 each for this wrongful internment. With this money, the Ishiharas established these funds in memory of their parents.

THE TAMA ISHIHARA MEMORIAL SCHOLARSHIP FUND: In memory of Tama Ishihara, who died in 2005 and was a valued member of the Concord Carlisle Scholarship Fund Board of Trustees from 1991 to 2000.

THE VINOD JALAN MEMORIAL SCHOLARSHIP FUND: In memory of Dr. Vinod Jalan who came to this country from India and had lived in Concord since 1979.

THE CASPER C. JENNEY and ELEANOR M. JENNEY MEMORIAL SCHOLARSHIP FUND: Established as the result of a bequest to CCSF from Casper Jenney who was a Concord businessman and philanthropist.

THE DIANE KENNEALLY MEMORIAL SCHOLARSHIP FUND: A 1980 graduate of Concord-Carlisle High School who received scholarships from the Fund from 1981 to 1983 while a student at Boston College School of Nursing.

THE KNIGHTS OF COLUMBUS SCHOLARSHIP FUND: The Concord Council of The Knights of Columbus established this fund on the 100th anniversary of its founding.

THE NORTON A. LEVY MEMORIAL SCHOLARSHIP FUND: In memory of a CCHS math teacher from 1954 to 1989.

THE CHARLES E. MANION, JR., MEMORIAL SCHOLARSHIP FUND: In memory of Chuck Manion, who died in an automobile accident while studying Wildlife Management at the University of Maine.

THE ADRIAN A. MARTINEZ MEMORIAL SCHOLARSHIP FUND: In memory of Adrian Martinez, CCHS Class of 2002. Who selflessly gave of himself to all who sought his help, whether academically as a gifted math student, or athletically as a champion distance runner.

THE ELIZABETH A. MATTISON MEMORIAL SCHOLARSHIP FUND: This Fund was established in 1994 by the children of Elizabeth A. Mattison in her memory.

THE BARBARA SCHIPS MILLER SCHOLARSHIP FUND: In honor of Barbara Schips Miller a psychology teacher in the Concord Schools for 35 years.

THE JANET GATES PECKHAM MEMORIAL SCHOLARSHIP FUND: In honor of Janet Peckham's retirement from her 27year career as an outstanding music educator in Carlisle.

THE ALBERT L. & JUNE B. POWERS SCHOLARSHIP FUND: In recognition of Al Power's contributions to the Concord-Carlisle community as a teacher of chemistry and head of the science department at Concord-Carlisle High School and as a Trustee and Treasurer of the Concord Carlisle Scholarship Fund.

THE MARGUERITE PURCELL MEMORIAL SCHOLARSHIP FUND: In memory of Marguerite (Peg) Purcell to honor the memory of this dedicated and loving wife, mother, and community volunteer.

THE NICK RESSLER MEMORIAL SCHOLARSHIP FUND: In memory of a promising student, artist, musician, athlete, and leader, who lost a courageous battle with cancer at the age of 14.

THE CHARLES A. ROBICHAUD SCHOLARSHIP FUND: In honor of Al Robichaud, who joined the science faculty at Concord-Carlisle High School in 1968 and also served as head football coach for 18 years. Al retired in 1997 after 29 years of service to Concord-Carlisle High School.

THE FARNHAM W. SMITH MEMORIAL SCHOLARSHIP FUND: In memory of one of the original founders of Concord Lumber Company who graduated from Concord High School in 1920.

THE MARK TEVEROVSKY MEMORIAL SCHOLARSHIP FUND: A Concord student who died unexpectedly, cutting short his education at Tufts University.

THE JEANNE A. TOOMBS MEMORIAL SCHOLARSHIP FUND: A life-long resident of Concord and a graduate of CCHS in 1966 who dedicated her life to the teaching of music in Concord.

THE VIDEO REVOLUTION, RALPH & ELLIE GROSSI SCHOLARSHIP FUND: In memory of Ralph Grossi, a.k.a. Mr. Movie, who spent the last 16 years of his life running Video Revolution in Concord.

THE DOUG WHITE MEMORIAL SCHOLARSHIP FUND: In memory of Doug White who grew up in Concord and graduated from CCHS in 1976. Doug was known for his love of sports and his commitment to his community.

THE CHARLES K. YEREMIAN MEMORIAL SCHOLARSHIP FUND: In memory of the head of music education in the Concord Public Schools and the Concord-Carlisle School District from 1945 to 1967
